

Jinx ends for Elway, AFC

Broncos upset defending champion Packers 31-24 in the most exciting Super Bowl in recent memory

SAN DIEGO (Associated Press) -- The drought is over for the Denver Broncos and the AFC. Terrell Davis scored on a 1-yard run with 1:45 remaining to give the Broncos a 31-24 win over Green Bay in Super Bowl XXXII.

The Broncos used a 49-yard drive to become the first AFC team to win the title since 1984. Davis, who was voted the game's MVP, was the key to the victory, running for 157 yards and a Super Bowl record three rushing touchdowns.

John Elway was 0-and-3 in Super Bowls before leading the Broncos to the victory. Elway failed to throw a scoring pass, but he did run for a touchdown. The Broncos took advantage of a pair of Brett Favre turnovers to score 10 points in the first half.
